Salvation Army	Informal meeting during the last weeks. A working group would replace the Advisory Committee, but a motion must be approved by City Council for this. Site plan and Programming public consultation work plan is wished by VCA, and Francophone community. Women will not be sheltered according to City decision. 99 beds, 32 units transitional and health units with on site support, special care unit 65 beds. Clients don't have to leave the building but must move during cleaning: heated terrasse and balconies provided. 4-5 beds per room. Only day program for families. Summer camps. Food bank on premise, perhaps in partnership with VCSC. Special care services with Ottawa inner city health. Post palliative care services. Max capacity for shelter is 5 per room- to be discussed re. pandemic needs. SA interested in providing	SA will attend a VCA meeting in the New Year. Q- City subsidies down 20% for shelters. Does the City still contribute? R-99 beds x 45\$ per diem per day. Less beds than before.

Q- Will the City focus more or solely on the SA? What about middle class families? R- The SA is proposing a new set of services as well; advisory Committee must propose social and health services not covered by SA and others, and our elected officials must coordinate in order to avoid duplicating services such as Food banks.

City Funding recipients – criteria must be reviewed, always same recipients.

Q- Food Bank monthly aide is based on postal code. SA food bank services to be clarified. Partage Vanier funding must be increased.

R- Inuit, Wabano food banks City funded. Bikers' Church run their own. Ongoing talks with VCSC. Food banks provide for 48-72 hrs. Coordination needed.

R- M. Fleury is not allowed to enforce. Staff is following up.

The MR Executive Director claims to have received emails, aggressive ones and threats. L. Touchant urges members to have constructive dialogue if we want to invite MR to our meetings.

Q-What is the City's vision for Vanier? The perception is that Vanier is a dumping ground. What are the other communities doing?

R-M. Fleury compares MR project to Metro sale and McArthur bowling sale; property sales cannot be controlled. Vanier secondary Plan will be an important tool to help shape a vision for Vanier. 2001 amalgamation: R1 homes, R3 (3 units) and R4 (10-40 units). Vanier is the last frontier for development in R4 zones.

215 North River Rd is R1 and was bought by a private enterprise. A family zone. A 12-car parking lot installed. A graduate knocked on a VCA member's door for money. A group home can be built every 300 meters in urban areas.

M. Fleury also wants to receive questions from VCA members: staff can follow up.
